Teen Pregnancy Prevention 101

This training is intended for professionals new to the field of adolescent pregnancy prevention. Participants review the basics of adolescent pregnancy prevention including pregnancy, birth and STI statistics; trends in adolescent pregnancy and sexual behaviors; basics of adolescent growth and development; risk and protective factors associated with adolescent pregnancy; and prevention strategies that work. Each participant will leave with a basic understanding of current research and resources, what to do to promote adolescent sexual health and where to go for more information and support. This training is offered twice a year at various locations across Minnesota.

Evidence-Based Programs

MOAPPP trains on a variety of evidence-based curricula. These highly interactive, **2 ½ day** trainings include a copy of the curriculum, as well as accompanying materials like student workbooks, video clips, and activity kits.

jGuide! – Designed for Latino youth ages 13-18, this curriculum emphasizes waiting to have sex and condom use while highlighting cultural values that support safer sex, and reframes cultural values that are perceived as barriers to safer sex.

Making Proud Choices – This 8-module curriculum, designed for youth ages 11-13, emphasizes waiting to have sex or using condoms if young people choose to have sex.

Safer Choices – This curriculum is taught in grades 9 and 10. Safer Choices involves teachers, parents, and community members to have a positive influence on adolescents' decisions regarding sex and help them feel supported in making healthy choices.

Teen Outreach Program – Designed for youth ages 12-19, this program incorporates a strong service-learning component based on principles of youth development to prevent adolescent pregnancy and help youth succeed in school.

Other Training and Presentation Topics

Teen Pregnancy Prevention 101
Participants review pregnancy, birth and STI statistics; trends in adolescent pregnancy and sexual behaviors; basics of adolescent growth and development; risk and protective factors associated with adolescent pregnancy; and prevention strategies that work. **(full day)**

It's That Easy

This training, for professionals who work with parents/caregivers of children aged birth to 18, demonstrates tools and techniques to engage parents in developmentally appropriate approaches to raising sexually healthy children. Participants receive the *It's That Easy* manual, a comprehensive guide for work with parents. **(2 days)**

Meeting the Unique Needs of Adolescent Mothers & Fathers

This workshop examines adolescent development; systems that impact adolescent parents; strengths, opportunities and challenges young parents bring to their new role; and data and current research on best practices for working with adolescent parents. Participants will also learn practical tips for helping adolescent parents understand their children's perspective and fun ways to communicate parenting concepts. **(half or full day)**

What About the Baby?

This workshop focuses on the importance of relationship – between adolescent parents and their children and between young families and the professionals who work with them. Participants will gain insight into the strengths and challenges faced by young parents, the competing developmental agendas of adolescent parents and their children, and strategies for promoting relationships that lead to the healthy development of both parent and child. **(full day)**

Getting to Outcomes: A Step-by-Step Process to Prevent Adolescent Pregnancy

Participants are guided through the Getting to Outcomes (GTO) framework, a process that helps practitioners use an evidence-based approach to plan, implement, evaluate and improve programs. GTO connects these essential ingredients for effective prevention programs. **(full day)**

Conducting a Community Needs Assessment

Participants will understand how to better assess the populations they serve, including examining cultural values and norms, in order to better select, adapt, and implement evidence-based adolescent pregnancy, HIV/STI prevention programs. **(full day)**

Developing a BDI Logic Model

Participants will understand how to develop BDI (Behavior-Determinant-Intervention) logic models to design and use programs to prevent adolescent pregnancy and HIV/STD. Participants apply the concepts of risk and protective factors to build their own BDI logic model. **(full day)**

Program Evaluation Basics

Participants will increase their ability to evaluate the effectiveness of adolescent sexual health programs by using basic evaluation tools, and use evaluation information to make appropriate program modifications by preparing an evaluation report. **(full day)**

Recipe for Success: Insight into Program Fidelity and Adaptation

Participants will learn about practical tools and resources to guide them in maintaining fidelity to core components of evidence-based curricula and make effective adaptations, and will come to understand why funders and decision-makers stress fidelity. **(full day)**

CQI/Program Sustainability

Participants learn how to conduct Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI) to strengthen their programs and plan for program sustainability. Participants will describe how CQI leads to program sustainability and develop a program sustainability action plan. **(full day)**

Developing Adolescent Parent Programs

Participants learn about program components necessary to provide support for both adolescents parents and their children. **(half day)**

Developing Programs for Young Fathers

Participants learn key components to designing programs for young fathers as well as techniques to recruit and retain program participants. **(half day)**
